In Nigeria, the body saddled with the responsibility of regulating exportation in Nigeria is the Nigerian Export Promotion Council (NEPC). Therefore, any individual or company that wants to go into this business, must first register and meet all requirements of the body before they can start exportation.

Requirements before Starting Export Business in Nigeria

- 1. Register the business
- 2. Register with the Nigerian Export Promotion Council
- 3. Register with Nigerian customs by filling the NXP form
- 4. Obtain special documents and permits for your goods (see details below)
- 5. Make sure your goods are not banned
- 6. Partner with a freight forwarding service company
- 7. Get an insurance cover
